They will be invited back the week after their final class to view a video of them performing. Those who express interest in continuing to sing will then, and only then, be offered membership information. The morning after the first class one of the students emailed Cate, saying she loved the class and couldn't wait for the next one. She also said her husband wanted to know if there was anything like that for men! You can't beat that! This success story is to be continued.

Our chapter quartet, Lagnaippe, has changed their name to Lyrical. Since they have a new tenor, Kristina Shapiro, they decided to have a new name, too. Kristina was on stage with the chorus for
