Grow with Data!



Did you know we have actually done market research for your specific areas? This is an incredibly valuable exercise that all businesses and groups do when they want to understand their community and what opportunities there might be in it. This information is available to each Chapter of Region 10 and is available to you on our website. *Just scan this QR code for access*.

Data isn't just for Baritones!



Where are your members?

Look at areas that are near you but not in another Chorus' area (if possible). Highlight the counties/parishes NOT on your neighboring Chorus data list/member highlighted list.



Overall, there are benefits to simply looking at your area from a different frame of reference – spend time looking rather than doubting – there are likely some things here you did not know!



Discuss barriers and how they relate to the policies and location of your Chorus—think of things like disabilities, distance to rehearsal, timeframe of commute, technology and finances.



Your members are the best recruiters! Look on page 1 of the information and highlight the counties/parishes your members currently live in.

Where are other Choruses?



Look at the areas where your Chorus provides performances, has rehearsals, and does community activities. Highlight the counties/parishes that you believe your Chorus is active.

Loud and clear data



Highlight those numbers that are above average for each listed County/Parish. Multiply .0054 by the total population – (this is the estimate of potential women singers for each County/Parish)

What are the barriers?



What can you do differently to attract new members? Discuss NEW initiatives based on what you see in the data.

Learn how to use your data at the virtual Fall Regional Education session—watch for date and time!!!





Some strategies worth thinking about include:

- Focus on one area or county for a concentrated effort – look at businesses in the area for sponsorship and performance opportunities e.g., physically "pound the pavement" and blanket the area.
- "Flash sing" event in parks and public areas in evenings when locals are there.
- Reach out to all performing groups in a particular area and host a "Sing Fest" to invite groups to sing for each other.
- Use the SAI Chorus Toolkit materials to get ideas.
- Produce marketing products in the 2 dominant languages of the area.
- Research large local events in an area and attend them with marketing materials.
- Research and connect with local Universities in your area.
